Ocean in a Bottle

A wave starts way out in the ocean, and it can travel for thousands of miles before it reaches shore. The wind's duration and its speed determine the amount of waves formed, and the size of each of them. As it nears land, not only does the wave increase in height, but the upper part of the wave (the part we can see) starts moving faster than the bottom part because it drags on the ocean floor. At this point, the wave starts to tip forward. When it leans over enough, the wave will curl over and crash, forming what is called a "breaker." Isn't that awesome? Create your own ocean with this craft

Supplies:

- Empty two-liter plastic bottle with lid
- Clear vegetable oil or mineral oil
- Water
- Funnel
- Blue food coloring
- Clean sand, small pebbles, seashells, glitter, small sea creature toys, etc.*
- White craft glue
- · Hot glue

Directions:

1. Fill a clean (labels removed) , clear two-liter bottle halfway with water.

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- 2. Add a couple drops of blue food coloring and swirl to mix.
- 3. If desired, add small pebbles, sand, sea shells, glitter, toys, etc.
- 4. Using a funnel, fill bottle all the way to the top with oil.
- 5. Making sure that the rim and cap are dry, apply white craft glue around the rim. Seal cap.
- 6. Apply a layer of hot glue around the outer edge of the cap for added protection from leakage.

*Tips

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Use lightweight starfish, shells and other sea creature toys that can float. Test them first in a bowl or glass of water. Find these at your local craft supply store or discount department store.
